## **SHIPLEY REGAINS TITLE WITH 3-0 WIN OVER WESTTOWN**

On Friday, November 4<sup>th</sup> Shipley hosted Westtown for the FSL championship in a rematch of last year's title tilt which Westtown won on penalty kicks. The Gators pushed forward from the start and four minutes into the game junior Sam Marks broke in on goal and was taken down in the area by the goalkeeper. Junior Kevin Staples converted from the penalty spot to give the hosts a 1-0 lead. Both teams had chances through the remainder of the first half, but none resulted in a goal. Westtown pressed early in the second half, but could not put the ball past sophomore keeper Pablo Sisniega. After a couple of close chances for Shipley junior Cal Hamilton scored in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute on a free kick which curled around the wall and into the side netting. Nine minutes later Marks scored his league leading 14<sup>th</sup> goal to provide extra insurance. Sisniega made 3 saves for the shutout.

Shipley reached the championship contest with a 4-1 win over Germantown on Tuesday, November 1<sup>st</sup>. The Tigers focused on preventing Marks from scoring, but the Gators' depth proved too much for the visitors. Freshman Konrad Bulonowski scored twice in the first half with assists from senior Evan Romano and classmate Kevin Carvalho. Sophomore Nico Rubino took over the scoring duties in the second half, also tallying twice with assists from Marks and senior Dan Gordon. The Tigers prevented a shutout with a goal in the 80<sup>th</sup> minute by senior Nick Miller assisted by classmate Diego Sanz de Acedo.

Also on the 1<sup>st</sup> Westtown topped host Friends' Central 1-0 on a 69<sup>th</sup> minute goal by junior Philip Rahling with an assist from senior Philip Marshall. After the visitors almost scored a second goal the Phoenix came roaring back and hit the cross bar and missed an open net all in the last 8 minutes of play, but Westtown held on for the win and a trip to the championship game for the second straight year. Nick Carnes made 7 saves for the shutout.

### PLAYOFF POSITIONS SET

With a pair of wins in the final week of the regular season Shipley (21 points) clinched the first place seed in the upcoming playoffs. The Gators will face Germantown which won its way into 4<sup>th</sup> place with a must-win decision over George. Friends' Central and Westtown tied for second with 19 points each. The Phoenix get the home field in the semifinal game having beaten Westtown during the regular season.

On Tuesday, October 18<sup>th</sup> Shipley visited Friends' Central in a matchup of the two teams at the top of the standings. Both teams had good chances in the first half, but neither could find the back of the net. In the second half the Gators hit a post and the crossbar on shots while the Phoenix had a number of free kicks sent just over the crossbar. With 11 minutes remaining Gator junior Sam Marks went one-on-one with a defender and was taken down for a penalty kick. Marks sent the ball under the diving keeper for a 1-0 Shipley win. Sophomore Pablo Sisniega was in goal for the shutout.

Also on the 18<sup>th</sup> Westtown visited Abington and took home a 5-1 win. Westtown went into halftime with a 1-1 tie on the first of three goals by junior Phillip Rahling in the 18<sup>th</sup> minute. The visitors were continually frustrated by the 'roos' offside trap. Once they figured this out at the intermission they were able to create and convert scoring opportunities. Rahling scored again in the 59<sup>th</sup> and 72<sup>nd</sup> minutes, while senior Cody Gray converted a penalty kick in the 46<sup>th</sup> minute and Brennan Kerr scored in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute. Kerr was assisted by Rahling, while Henry McCauley and Phillip Cottrone assisted on Rahling's scores. Abington's goal came from Dan Feinberg in the 22<sup>nd</sup> minute with an assist from Cristian Cepeda.

The third game on the 18<sup>th</sup> had host George School top Friends Select 4-1. The Cougars opened the scoring in the 33<sup>rd</sup> minute on a goal by senior Caleb Smith with an assist from junior Paolo Alighieri.

Six minutes later freshman Timofei Kharisov volleyed in a cross from senior Anthony Verleysen. Early in the second half the Falcons narrowed the margin to 2-1 on a penalty kick by junior Ben Holl. The Cougars responded in the 56<sup>th</sup> minute on a goal by junior Will Yarnall, assisted by classmate Justin Mendez. Mendez closed out the scoring on a 20-yarder in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute with an assist from Alighieri.

The final contest on the 18<sup>th</sup> saw visiting Germantown top Academy of the New Church 3-1. The Lions opened the scoring in the 15<sup>th</sup> minute on a goal by senior Alex Bock with a flick-on assist from classmate Brett Doering after a long throw from Luke Frazier. The Tigers responded with goals in the 29<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> minutes. The first goal was a header by senior Henry Bushnell off a free kick by classmate Nick Miller. Two minutes later junior Will Randall found senior Diego Sanz de Acedo who scored a pretty goal from the top of the box. The 2-1 score held until the 73<sup>rd</sup> minute when the Tigers were finally able to knock home an insurance goal. Bushnell scored with an assist from junior Sam Hill-Cristol.

A makeup game was played on Thursday, October 20<sup>th</sup>, with host Friends Select topping Abington 3-2. After a 1-1 first half with goals by sophomore Davon Wanza for the hosts and senior Josh Holin for the visitors, Holin tallied again in the second half to put the 'roos ahead 2-1. Holl tied the score for the Falcons before senior Daniel Mauri netted the gamewinner in the 75<sup>th</sup> minute.

On the 21<sup>st</sup> there were three close contests, with host Friends' Central topping Abington 1-0 and visiting Westtown beating George by the same score, while host Germantown needed overtime to beat Moorestown 2-1. The fourth game saw Shipley blank Select 4-0. Central rode a first half goal by junior Sam Stein and the shutout keeping of Noah Schoenberg to their 1-0 win. Junior Peter Bockarie got the assist. At George School, Westtown controlled the game for the first 15 to 20 minutes before it settled into a steady state of attacking and counter-attacking without either team being able to convert their chances. George controlled the beginning of the second half until Westtown took over the game again to create two very good chances. In the 61<sup>st</sup> minute, senior Cody Gray received a free kick inside the box and knocked it down towards senior Isaac Arthur who swiftly tucked it away. George pressed the rest of the game but the Westtown defense held their ground. Nick Carnes made 4 saves for

the shutout. Shipley parlayed a hat-trick by Marks and a goal by Jimi Demiajay into a 4-0 win over Select. No other details were available. The final game on the 21<sup>st</sup> saw Germantown keep their playoff hopes alive with a win in extra time against Moorestown. The Foxes opened the scoring in the 12<sup>th</sup> minute on a direct kick by junior Ethan Carilli from near midfield that went over the outstretched arms of the Tiger sophomore keeper Luke Scott. The 1-0 score held until the 64<sup>th</sup> minute when Randall received a cross from junior Nic Solomon and dodged the onrushing keeper to knock the ball into the unattended goal. Miller scored the game-winner 9 minutes into the first overtime on a set piece with an assist from Hill-Cristol. It was Miller's first varsity goal. Scott made a pair of fine saves in the second overtime to keep the Tigers' lead secure.

The final game of the regular season was played on Monday, October 24<sup>th</sup> as GFS hosted George in a makeup of a rainout from September 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Tigers needed a win to advance to the playoffs, while the Cougars could clinch 4<sup>th</sup> place with a tie or a win. The game was very exciting with plenty of scoring chances, but remained scoreless for the first 70 minutes. GFS got on the board first on a 71<sup>st</sup> minute goal by Bushnell under the diving George School keeper. George pushed back hard and knotted the score at 1-1 in the 76<sup>th</sup> minute on a goal by Yarnall at the near post after a corner kick from senior Evan McGowan. After the clock was stopped for a GFS injury, the Tigers put together a well-executed sequence, started by Hill-Cristol who fed an overlapping Bushnell who hit a cross that Randall volleyed into the net from near the penalty spot with about a minute left in regulation. The Tigers held on for the final ticks and found themselves in the playoffs thanks to a 3-game winning streak.

## FRIENDS' CENTRAL SITS AT THE TOP

With a week and a pair of makeup games left in the regular season, Friends' Central has a one-point edge over Shipley. Week 5 saw 7 games played, with Select-Abington on Friday postponed due to weather. Two games were decided in overtime, while four of the five others had a goal differential of only one or two.

On Tuesday, October 11<sup>th</sup> Shipley beat host Abington 5-1. Abington scored early in the first half on a shot by Tim Israel off a corner from Joe Harding. From that point on in the first half Shipley had the better chances, but could only convert one into a goal by junior Sam Marks with an assist from sophomore Nico Rubino. Early in the second half the same combination struck on a quick restart and then Dan Leone scored directly on a corner kick to give the Gators a 3-1 advantage. Rubino scored the fourth goal for the visitors with an assist from Fred Rugirio. With time winding down junior Steve Arena closed out the scoring with an assist from classmate Kevin Staples. Also on the 11<sup>th</sup> Friends' Central traveled to Bryn Athyn and took home a 2-0 win. After a scoreless first half, the Phoenix struck early in the second stanza with a goal in the 43<sup>rd</sup> minute by junior Zach Kratzman with an assist from senior Joe Brodsky. Junior Sam Stein netted the insurance goal in the 69<sup>th</sup> minute with an assist from sophomore Nicolas Harris. Senior Noah Schoenberg turned a way 8 shots for the shutout. At Moorestown, the hosts used a 78<sup>th</sup> minute goal on a volley off a rebound by junior Ethan Carilli to top visiting Friends Select 2-1. The goal followed a scramble in front of the goal after a Moorestown corner kick. The Foxes opened the scoring in the 11<sup>th</sup> minute on a volley goal from junior Tim Latimer after receiving a throw-in from senior Bryan Gfeller. The hosts had the better of the play in the first half, but the Falcons game on strong after intermission and scored in the 62<sup>nd</sup> minute on a fine individual effort by Bekim

Daku. The final game on the 11<sup>th</sup> proved to be a defensive struggle as Germantown visited Westtown with both sides holding the other scoreless into overtime. After a scoreless first half, Moorestown scored twice in a 6 minute stretch midway through the second frame. In the 61<sup>st</sup> minute sophomore Tyler Mills knocked in a corner kick from freshman David Howarth. In the 67<sup>th</sup> minute sophomore Andy Schultz scored after Gfeller was stuffed on a breakaway. Junior Kyle Price notched 7 saves in the shutout. Also on the 14<sup>th</sup> Friends' Central topped host Westtown in another defensive struggle, 1-0 on a late second-half goal by Stein with an assist from sophomore Gabe Tagliamonte. The goal was Stein's league-leading 9<sup>th</sup> of the season. Schoenberg again made 8 saves for the shutout. The Phoenix have allowed only two goals in 6 league games. The final contest on the 14<sup>th</sup> was an overtime thriller which saw visiting George School come back from two goals down late in the second half, only to see the Gators notch the game-winner in overtime for a 3-2 win. The hosts scored early in the first half on a goal by Staples with an assist from Stephen Gentry and had the better of the play but could not add to their advantage. Early in the second half junior Sam Marks converted a penalty kick to put Shipley up 2-0 and tie Stein for the league lead in goals at 9. Slowly the Cougars edged back into the game, scoring first in the 70<sup>th</sup> minute on a goal by junior Zack Kimelheim with an assist from brother Noah. Zack then assisted classmate Paolo Alighieri in the 80<sup>th</sup> minute to send the contest into overtime. In the 96<sup>th</sup> minute Shipley intercepted a clearance by the George School keeper and senior Dan Gordon netted the game-winner with an assist from Marks.

## GEORGE, WESTTOWN AND FRIENDS' CENTRAL TIED AT THE TOP

On Monday 9/26 Westtown visited Fairmount Park and came home with a 4-0 win over host Friends Select. Junior Phillip Rahling struck for a hat trick, while his brother Michael, a senior, netted the other goal. Phillip scored in the 19<sup>th</sup>, 59<sup>th</sup> and 74<sup>th</sup> minutes, and Michael tucked one home in the 63<sup>rd</sup> minute. Sophomore Jared Marshall assisted on the first-half goal and freshman Sami Phelps set up the final tally. Senior Nick Carnes made two saves for the shutout.

On Tuesday 9/27 Abington traveled to Bryn Athyn and brought home a 3-2 overtime win against ANC. The hosts opened the scoring in the 18<sup>th</sup> minute on a goal by senior Brett Doering assisted by sophomore Clay Cronlund. That score held through halftime. The 'roos tallied in the 44<sup>th</sup> and 64<sup>th</sup> minutes on goals by seniors Josh Holin and Zandy Schreiber. Assists came from sophomores Sam Pardys and Mariano Cepeda. Lions' senior Christian Buss nailed a spectacular 25 yard free kick in the 76<sup>th</sup> minute to knot the score again. In the second overtime a tussle in the box yielded a red card for ANC and a penalty kick which Abington sophomore Joey Harding converted for the final one goal margin. A second game on the 27<sup>th</sup> was aborted early in the second half due to lightning, with host Friends' Central leading Germantown 3-0. Zack Kimmelheim scored the other goal in the 16<sup>th</sup> minute with an assist from senior Tommy Lodge-Yanez. Simon James made one save in notching the shutout. At Moorestown, junior Jason Clough opened the scoring for the Phoenix with an unassisted goal in the 27<sup>th</sup> minute. Bockarie then took over and tallied for the visitors in the 43<sup>rd</sup> and 48<sup>th</sup> minutes. Brodsky assisted on the first of the two goals, while the second was a fine individual effort. Moorestown earned a penalty kick in the 53<sup>rd</sup> minute and freshman David Howarth converted for the Foxes. Central keeper Schoenberg made several key saves down the stretch to keep the final score 3-1. At Shipley, Westtown sophomore Jared Marshall opened the scoring early with a 2<sup>nd</sup> minute goal assisted by senior Cody Gray. Shipley wasted no time equalizing on a free kick by junior Cal Hamilton. After back-and-forth play Gray scored a 27<sup>th</sup> minute goal for 'town with an assist from classmate Phillip Marshall. The play continued at a hectic pace through the final whistle, with both teams having chances, but neither being able to put the ball across the goal line.

On Thursday 10/6 Germantown beat Select at Edgley 2-1. After a scoreless first half during which the visitors had the better of the play, the hosts scored first early in the second half after a goalmouth scramble when sophomore Davon Wanza knocked the ball across the line. The Tigers took over from there and in the 60<sup>th</sup> minute a corner kick found the head of senior Hank Goldenberg who nodded it across the goalmouth where classmate Gilman Myran headed it in.
