SHIPLEY TOPS GERMANTOWN FOR TITLE

On Friday, October 31st Shipley faced Germantown for the Friends Schools League title for the third straight year. The Gators prevailed 4-1, reversing last year's result. The Tigers opened the scoring in the 3rd minute when senior Abdus Muwwakkil fed junior Manolo Sanchez who beat three defenders and the keeper. Eleven minutes later sophomore Geoff Stewart scored on a well struck side-winder half volley off a pass from his twin brother Mike. Shipley took the lead for good in the 30th minute on a header by junior Evan Seltzer off a feed from classmate Miles Doolittle. The score remained 2-1 until midway through the second half when a foul was called on the Tigers in the penalty area. Senior Ginaluca Ridolfi netted the PK to give the hosts some breathing room. Germantown threatened, but could not score and Shipley closed out the scoring with 5 minutes remaining on a tally by Mike Stewart with an assist from freshman Dan Gordon.

Shipley reached the championship game with a 4-3 penalty kick shootout semifinal win over 4th place George School on Wednesday, October 29th. Although Shipley enjoyed a 21-7 advantage in shots, they could not score in regulation or overtime. Neither could the Cougars, and so the result was determined by PK's (for the first time since George topped ANC in the 2000 semifinals). Gators' junior keeper Nick Irvine made the key save to put Shipley through to the finals. The other semifinal saw number 2 seed Germantown blank number 3 Westtown 4-0. The Tigers jumped out front early as senior Caleb MacTavish scored in the 5th minute on a pass from junior Marcelo Osorio-Soto. Sanchez scored on a penalty kick in the 24th minute. Three minutes later Sanchez fed classmate Jason Symonette who knocked in a short ball in a crowd. Shortly after halftime Symonette closed out the scoring with an assist from senior Jack Koehler. Senior Zach Fernberger and junior Jay Query shared the shutout in goal.

SANCHEZ AND SELTZER LEAD ALL-LEAGUE SQUAD

Germantown junior Manolo Sanchez and Shipley junior Evan Seltzer were named all-Southeast PA and all-state by the league coaches. SEMIFINALS POSTPONED; SHIPLEY & GFS TO HOST

The semifinal games originally scheduled for Tuesday, October 28th have been postponed to Wednesday, October 29th. Shipley hosts George in one contest, while Germantown hosts Westtown in the other. The championship game is still scheduled for Friday, October 31st if the semifinals can be played on Wednesday. A night and day of rain made playing conditions unsafe, forcing the postponement. The semifinal pairings were set up by results in the past 10 days. Here are summaries of those games.

On Tuesday, October 14th Germantown traveled to Abington and finished with a 3-0 win. Junior Manolo Sanchez was involved in all three goals, scoring two and assisting on one. Midway through the first half he took a corner kick to the far post which senior Caleb MacTavish headed back to the near-side netting. The 1-0 score held for about forty minutes until Sanchez broke past a couple of defenders and beat the 'roos keeper. Eight minutes later Sanchez finished the scoring, converting a throw in from senior Ari Keitzman. Senior Zach Fernberger and junior Jay Query shared the shutout.

Also on the 14th visiting Westtown topped Academy of the New Church 1-0 in a very even match, with a number of scoring opportunities for both teams. In the 22nd minute junior Jake Shorr received a long ball and laid it off into the goal area where senior Yong Dae Kim finished. Although Westtown hit a number of posts and crossbars they could not score again. Junior Erich Siriek made 8 saves for the shutout.

Shipley hosted Moorestown on the 14th and handed the visitors a 4-0 defeat. In the 26th minute junior Evan Seltzer passed to senior Gianluca Ridolfi who scored on a 30-yard upper corner shot. That was all the first-half scoring. In the second half sophomore Geoff Stewart collected a missed clearance and scored on a 35-yarder which fooled the Foxes' keeper. Moorestown nearly pulled to within one when a direct kick just barely went over the goal. With 20 minutes remaining Seltzer and Ridolfi again paired up to give the Gators an insurance goal. Minutes later Stewart closed out the scoring with a spectacular bending shot that dipped into the far upper corner. Junior Nick Irvine made 6 saves for the shutout.

Friends' Central visited Friends Select in the final game on the 14th and came home with their first League win of the season, 2-1. No details are available as of yet.

On Friday, October 17th Westtown hosted Friends Select and won 2-1. The Falcons opened up in control of the midfield, but could not translate this into any goals. Westtown began to turn the tide and in the 28th minute senior Samuel Peporah recovered a deflection off a Falcon defender and passed to Yong Dae Kim who netted the goal. Just after halftime the hosts' Andrew Fairchild (SR) took a corner kick which junior Jon Schauer headed home. Ten minutes later Select senior Zach Winthrop converted a penalty kick for the 2-1 final.

Also on the 17th host George School used two goals in each half to blank Moorestown 4-0. Junior Chris Cho opened the scoring in the 8th minute after a goalmouth scramble with the assist coming from junior Seamus Trull. Trull then

volleyed in a goal at the back post in the 25th minute with an assist from sophomore Richie Schulz. Schulz scored both of the second half goals, the first in the 41st minute with an assist from Trull and the second on an unassisted takeaway from the Foxes' keeper in the 49th minute. Junior Jas Chojnowski recorded seven saves for the Cougars' shutout.

ANC also won on the 17th by a 4-0 score over host Abington. Lions' senior Kenny Ross scored in the 4th and 78th minutes with assists from sophomore Greg Synnestvedt and junior Blake McCurdy. Senior Chris Hyatt's 17th minute shot was parried by the keeper and knocked home by classmate Dana Ayers. Hyatt then scored unassisted in the 34th minute. Senior Dustin Synnestvedt notched six saves for the shutout.

The final game on the 17th saw host Shipley top Friends' Central 4-1. Sophomore Mike Stewart nailed an intercepted clearance in the 25th minute to open the scoring for the Gators. The score held at 1-0 through the half. At the 45 minute mark Keith Bradley made it 2-0 with an assist from Ridolfi after a goalmouth scramble. In the 50th minute Stewart fed Ridolfi who made it 3-0. The Phoenix got onto the board with 15 minutes left and Shipley closed the scoring on a header by Zac Arch from Seltzer's set piece.

On 10/21 Shipley traveled to friends Select and came home with a 5-0 win. The visitors, who led 3-0 at the half, got goals from Ridolfi, both Stewarts, Dan Gordon and Tom Scullin. Seltzer and Derrick Smith each had two assists and Gordon also had an assist.

Also on the 21st Abington topped Friends' Central 2-1. Junior Mac Todman and Senior John McGlynn scored for the 'roos.

The third game on the 21st had host Westtown top George School 2-1. Yong Dae Kim opened the scoring for the winners on a fine individual effort. The Cougars tied it up on a goal by freshman Gabe Haug with an assist from Trull. Yong headed in the game winner in the 70th minute on a flighted cross from sophomore Joon Suh. The win clinched third place for the hosts.

In the final contest on the 21st host Germantown used a 3-0 halftime advantage to best ANC 5-2. MacTavish opened the scoring in the 12th minute on a feed from Sanchez. In the 37th minute Sanchez scored with an assist from senior Jack Koehler. Seconds before the half Koehler fed junior Jason Symonette for the third goal. In the 48th minute Ross fed sophomore Jon Riles and they switched roles on a 71st minute goal. In between, Tiger junior Marcelo Osorio-Soto scored twice with assists from Sanchez and classmate Sam Mercuris.

The final regular season game was played on Thursday, 10/23 and George School beat Friends' Central 3-1 to clinch the final playoff spot. Cho opened the scoring for the Cougars in the 7th minute, heading home a cross from Trull. The Phoenix tied it up in the 17th minute on a blast by freshman Joey Brodsky. Senior Arie Manders scored the gamewinner in the 53rd minute with an assist from junior Aiden Schmidtberger. An insurance goal was added four minutes later when senior Kyle Scott deflected a hard shot by Schmidtberger into the goal.

SHIPLEY TOPS GERMANTOWN 4-3: HOLDS 1ST PLACE

On a beautiful day for soccer four league games were contested on Tuesday, October 7th. Shipley took home a 3-1 win over ANC in Bryn Athyn. The Gators jumped on top right away with junior Evan Seltzer heading in a corner kick in the 3rd minute of play. In the 29th minute junior Mike Stewart slid and knocked in a cross from sophomore younger brother Geoff. Eight minutes into the second half sophomore Zac Arch closed out the scoring for the winners when he came from his defender position to head in a set piece. The Lions got on the board in the 72nd minute when seniors Chris Hyatt and Kenny Ross executed a nice give and go which sent Ross on a breakaway which he converted. Shipley's other assists were from Seltzer and senior Gianluca Ridolfi.

Moorestown hosted Abington in a game which was scoreless for much of the first half before the Foxes tallied four straight goals on the way to a 4-2 win over the 'roos. Sophomore John Latimer broke the ice in the 26th minute scoring off a lofted ball from senior Derek Preston. Junior Ben Lasserre then took over for the hosts, scoring a natural hat trick in the 45th, 52nd and 59th minutes. The first was a breakaway. The second came off a pass from senior Mike Stobbe and the third was a direct kick. Abington scored in the 65th and 76th minutes on goals from senior David Contosta and starting keeper-turned field player Nate Simon.

At Germantown the Tigers remained undefeated in league play with a 3-1 win over Westtown. The hosts had a 20-4 shot advantage and put the first goal on the board in the 5th minute when senior Abdus Salaam Muwwakkil made a perfect pass to junior Jason Symonette who scored easily. Westtown's junior keeper Erich Sirinek denied

Muwakkil on a header ticketed for the far corner to keep the score at 1-0 at the half. The Tigers scored early in the second half on a solo effort by junior Manolo Sanchez who got the ball to the end line and cut it across to senior Jack Koehler who was there to knock it home. Westtown responded two minutes later with a goal from the left flank by junior Jake Shorr with an assist from classmate Sean Reitman. In the 60th minute Symonette fed Sanchez who beat the keeper one-on-one and gave the hosts some insurance.

George School traveled to Friends Select and tallied a goal in each half to top the Falcons, 2-0. Senior Max Mosley knocked in a goal-mouth scramble in the 29th minute with an assist from classmate Kyle Scott. In the 58th minute Scott scored on a solo effort. Junior Jas Chojnowski had 3 saves to preserve the shutout for the Cougars.

In the long-awaited rematch of last year's championship game, host Shipley topped Germantown 4-3 on Friday, October 10th. The Gators jumped on top early, scoring three unanswered goals in the first 16 minutes of play. Geoff Stewart fed brother Mike twice to surround a Kevin Cella goal with an assist from Arch. Senior Caleb MacTavish got the Tigers on the board in the 24th minute. But Ridolfi fed Seltzer just a minute before halftime to put the hosts up 4-1. The second half was a different story, however as the visitors roared back to make a game of it. Sanchez scored on a direct kick which changed direction on a deflection off the wall in the 69th minute. Five minutes later Symonette brought the Tigers to within one with a goal from close in. In the final 30 seconds a final Tiger attempt to knot the score soared over the goal and the Gators had the win.

Also on the 10th host Westtown blanked Abington 3-0. Shorr opened the scoring in the 11th minute and then assisted on the final two goals, a 16th minute tally by sophomore Joon Suh and a 76th minute insurance goal by junior Jon Schauer. 'town keeper Sirinek notched the shutout.

In last week's Westtown-Friends' Central game Phoenix senior Dan Adelson scored off an indirect kick in the 18th minute and then Westtown senior Andrew Fairchild knotted the score six minutes later. And so it stayed through regulation and until Shorr took matters into his own hands (or feet) with OT goals in the 86th and 90th minutes and an assist for senior Yong Dae Kim in the 93rd minute.

GATORS, TIGERS REMAIN UNDEFEATED; WILL MEET ON 10/10

On a soggy Friday, September 26th all four league games were contested, although in less than ideal conditions. All the games were close, with Abington being the only home team to secure a win. Moorestown won a 2-1 thriller at Friends' Central as junior Ben Lasserre collected a missed Phoenix clearance at the top of the D with just 10 seconds remaining in regulation and fired home a 22-yarder for the win. The Foxes opened the scoring in the 10th minute when Lasserre slotted a pass to senior Mike Stobbe who finished to the left of the keeper. The Phoenix responded when Harry Pharamond got on the end of a long free kick and knotted the score in the 16th minute. After that the game was played cautiously with not many scoring chances until Lasserre's last second heroics. The win over the Phoenix was the first for the Foxes since 1999.

At ANC senior Arie Manders netted a hat trick for visiting George School, including the game-winner in the first overtime period, and saved a ball off the goal line to pace the Cougars to a 4-3 win. Manders opened the scoring in the 8th minute, heading in a cross from classmate Kyle Scott. Ten minutes later Cougar sophomore Richie Schulz scored on a diving header off a cross from junior Chris Cho. ANC countered in the 26th minute when senior Kenny Ross beat three defenders on the end line and dished to freshman Travis McCurdy who finished to pull the Lions to within one. ANC gained some momentum at this point, but it was thwarted by a Manders' 25-yarder with just two minutes remaining in the half. ANC came out stronger in the second half and pulled to within one in the 52nd minute when Ross crossed a long ball and junior Caleb Sansom finished the keeper's parry. The Lions knotted the score in the 77th minute when sophomore Jon Riles knocked in a ball which popped out to him after a scramble in the goalmouth. In the first overtime ANC's keeper ventured out of the box to clear a ball, miskicked it to Manders who hit a long shot into the net. Although ANC had the better of the play through the second half and the overtime, in the end they had no answer for Manders.

At Westtown Shipley used a first half penalty kick and an early second-half goal to take a 2-0 lead and held on to win 2-1. Sophomore Geoff Stewart scored on a PK in the 13th minute and junior Evan Seltzer tallied in the 52nd minute off an assist from Mike Stewart to put the Gators up 2-0. Junior Jon Schauer brought the hosts to within one goal in the 69th minute with an assist from senior Sam Peperah, but they could not put home the equalizer.

Host Abington also netted a penalty kick (junior Manish Kurien in the 20th minute) and added a breakaway goal by junior Mac Todman just before halftime to top Friends Select 2-0. Nate Simon posted the shutout for the 'roos.

On Wednesday, October 1st ANC rode Ross' second goal of the game to a 3-2 home win on a slick field over Moorestown. The Foxes opened the scoring in the 21st minute when Stobbe headed home Lasserre's corner kick. Sansom knotted the score in the 26th minute when he converted the rebound of his own shot. Ross gave the hosts the lead 30 seconds later when he tallied from 18 yards with an assist from senior Chris Hyatt. Lasserre tied the match in the 66th minute with an assist from Stobbe. Ross took a pass from McCurdy in the 73rd minute and put in the game-winner hard and low to the far post.

On Friday, October 3rd Germantown visited George School and came home with a 2-1 win. Senior Alex Reese opened the scoring for the Cougars in the 13th minute with an assist from Schulz. A 25th minute throw in by Tiger senior Ari Kietzman went off classmate Caleb MacTavish before being knocked in for an own goal by a George defender. Sanchez netted the game-winner just one minute before halftime with an assist from Symonette.

Also on the 3rd, Friends Select used a second half penalty kick and a staunch defense to hold off visiting Moorestown 1-0. The Falcons loaded up in the defensive end, thwarting all attacks by the Foxes and were awarded a penalty kick in the 50th minute. Senior Zach Winthrop took the kick, but it was saved by Moorestown keeper Justin Stark, only to have the rebound bounce right back to Winthrop who knocked it home for the game's only goal. Ben Roach was in goal for the shutout for the hosts.

Shipley scored three early goals at home to put Abington in an early hole on the way to a 6-1 Gators' win. Sophomore central defender Zac Arch caught the 'roos by surprise in the first minute of play as he made a lengthy solo effort ending with a successful shot. Minutes later senior Gianluca Ridolfi scored and then went in one-on-one on the keeper again this time lofting the ball over the keeper where Geoff Stewart knocked the ball home. Seltzer scored twice in the second half and Stewart added his second goal. Abington's only score came on a well struck direct kick by senior Brian Hood.

According to the newspaper Westtown beat Friends' Central in the final game on 10/3 by a 4-1 score in overtime. There has been no confirmation of that by either coach.

Tigers Open Title Defense With Three Wins

Germantown traveled to Moorestown on Thursday, September 18th to open defense of their 2007 league title. The Tigers came home with a 3-0 win. Junior Jason Symonette headed in a cross from senior Caleb MacTavish in the second minute to open the scoring. Moorestown stayed in the game by blocking shots in the defense and kept the score at 1-0 through the 71st minute. A hand ball in the area gave the visitors a penalty kick which junior Manolo Sanchez converted and then Symonette closed out the scoring with a 78th minute goal with an assist going to junior Sam Mercuris. Senior Zach Fernberger turned away 3 shots for the shutout.

On Friday, September 19th ANC visited Friends' Central and returned to Bryn Athyn with a 2-0 win. This was the Lions' first win over the Phoenix since 2002. The game was scoreless until just seconds before halftime when Senior Kenny Ross scored on a breakaway with the assist coming from classmate Dana Ayers. Ross put in the insurance goal with 6 minutes left with an assist from junior Caleb Sansom. Senior Dustin Synnestvedt made just one save in recording the shutout. The Lions had more opportunities than the hosts, but the Phoenix defense kept the game close until the very end.

Also on the 19th visiting Shipley topped George School 2-0. After a scoreless first half, the Gators asserted themselves in the second stanza, tallying first in the 46th minute on a near-post goal by junior Evan Seltzer. Senior Gianluca Ridolfi netted the insurance goal in the 71st minute from 25 yards out. Junior netminder Nicholas Irvine recorded 4 saves, all in the first half on the way to the shutout. The Gators outshot the Cougars 21 to 9.

On Saturday, September 20th Germantown hosted Friends Select and blanked the visitors 2-0. The Falcons played a very defensive setup often packing the box with 9 players. After controlling the play for most of the early going the Tigers got on the board in the 29th minute when Sanchez knocked in a cross from Symonette. The Falcons kept the score a 1-0 through the 60th minute when they were awarded a direct kick from about 25 yards as the result of a hand ball. Senior Zach Winthrop drilled the ball to the near post but Fernberger was there with a full out dive and smother to deny the goal. In the 70th minute the Tigers were awarded one of their many corner kicks and junior Brendan Turner hit an inswinger which managed to cross the goal line before being cleared by a Falcon defender. Fernberger was really only tested twice in posting his second consecutive shutout.

On Tuesday, September 23rd four league games were played with three of them resulting in shutouts. In the only game so far this season where both teams scored, Moorestown got a second-half hat trick from junior Ben Lasserre to turn back visiting Westtown 3-2. The visitors had opened the scoring at the 12 minute mark on a goal

by senior Sam McCauley. Two additional first-half shots hit the post for Westtown, limiting them to a 1-0 halftime advantage. Lasserre took over in the second half with a penalty kick at 63:30, a bending 20-yard direct kick to the near post 5 minutes later and a solo effort past three defenders in the 72nd minute. Westtown was not finished, however, as senior Yong Dae Kim scored in the 77th minute and the potential tying goal rocketed off the cross bar with just 1:30 remaining. The win was the first for the Foxes over Westtown since a 2-1 overtime win in 2001.

Also on the 23rd ANC blanked visiting Select 4-0. The Lions opened the scoring in the 10th minute when Ross hit a shot which tipped the keeper's fingertips and the inside of the post before caroming in. Sophomore Jon Riles got the assist. The score remained 1-0 through the 54th minute when Sansom took a hard shot and Riles knocked in the rebound. ANC sewed up the match with insurance goals in the 76th and 79th minutes. Senior Chris Hyatt scored after a scramble on a cross from classmate Graham Lermite. Junior Blake McCurdy closed out the scoring with an assist from classmate Nick Tate. Synnestvedt was in goal again for the shutout.

Germantown posted their third league shutout in as many games with a 3-0 win over visiting Friends' Central. In the 22nd minute Sanchez broke through the Phoenix defense and laid a ball off to junior Marcelo Osorio-Soto who pounded it home.
